LEADERS INTERVIEW



TIM MORAN – Managing Director – Lineage Logistics UK

Tim will be talking to Shane Brennan about Lineage Logistics mission to reimagine the worlds food supply chain. Having acquired the Partner Logistics and Yearsley Logistics businesses in recent years Lineage has quickly become the largest specialist third party logistics specialist in frozen food in the UK.
